Quick Facts

1. Economic Multiplier

The past two years Renaissance has received additional external funding, in the amounts of \$46 500+ (2013) and \$33 500 (2012)

All of this money was invested here: In community members and community projects.

2. Granting Support

Renaissance works hard to network and assist organizations to find resources, by connecting people to funders, partner organizations, and building resources.

3. Capacity Building, Networking

The Community Engagement Coordinator of Renaissance sits on over 8 committees and cross-pollinates community events through all sectors.

4. Employment

This year alone Renaissance has employed 4 fulltime summer students, and 2 local High School students Part-Time.

Community Forests International is a locally-based international NGO, regarded highly by the European Union for their work with climate change adaptation in Pemba Tanzania. CFI states that Renaissance funding was instrumental in encouraging them to relocate to Sackville. CFI now employs 6 people and runs a local business called EcoScape.
